

In order to convey a sense of the approach and level of critical sophistication of individual items, Roberts often quotes at length in his detailed descriptive annotations, a method that allows the reader to judge for himself the usefulness of a particular book or essay. The chronological listing permits the reader to obtain quickly a sense of the various shifts and developments that occurred in Donne scholarship during the eleven-year period covered.
