# SAMLA Prize for an Outstanding Article in the SAR

- 1. A prize will be awarded for an outstanding article that has been submitted to the *SAR* and published in the November, January, or May issue. Presidential addresses and other solicited papers are excluded from the competition.
- 2. All eligible articles will be considered, but nominations for the prize, accompanied by a brief statement of justification, will be solicited from the members of the SAR Editorial Board. The membership at large is also invited to submit nominations.
- 3. Nominations should be sent to the Executive Director of SAMLA by **1** August. The Executive Director will then forward the nominations to a selection panel of five (5) members appointed by the Executive Committee of SAMLA. The names of the panel members are listed in the September Program issue of the SAR.
- 4. Selections of the winning essay will be by ballot among the members of the selection panel. The mechanics of voting will be decided by the panel.
- 5. The recipient of the prize will be awarded a citation and a check for \$300.00 at the annual SAMLA convention. Honorable mention may be made of the first runner-up if the selection panel so desires. The third prize is to be awarded in November 1986.
